

When to Stay Home

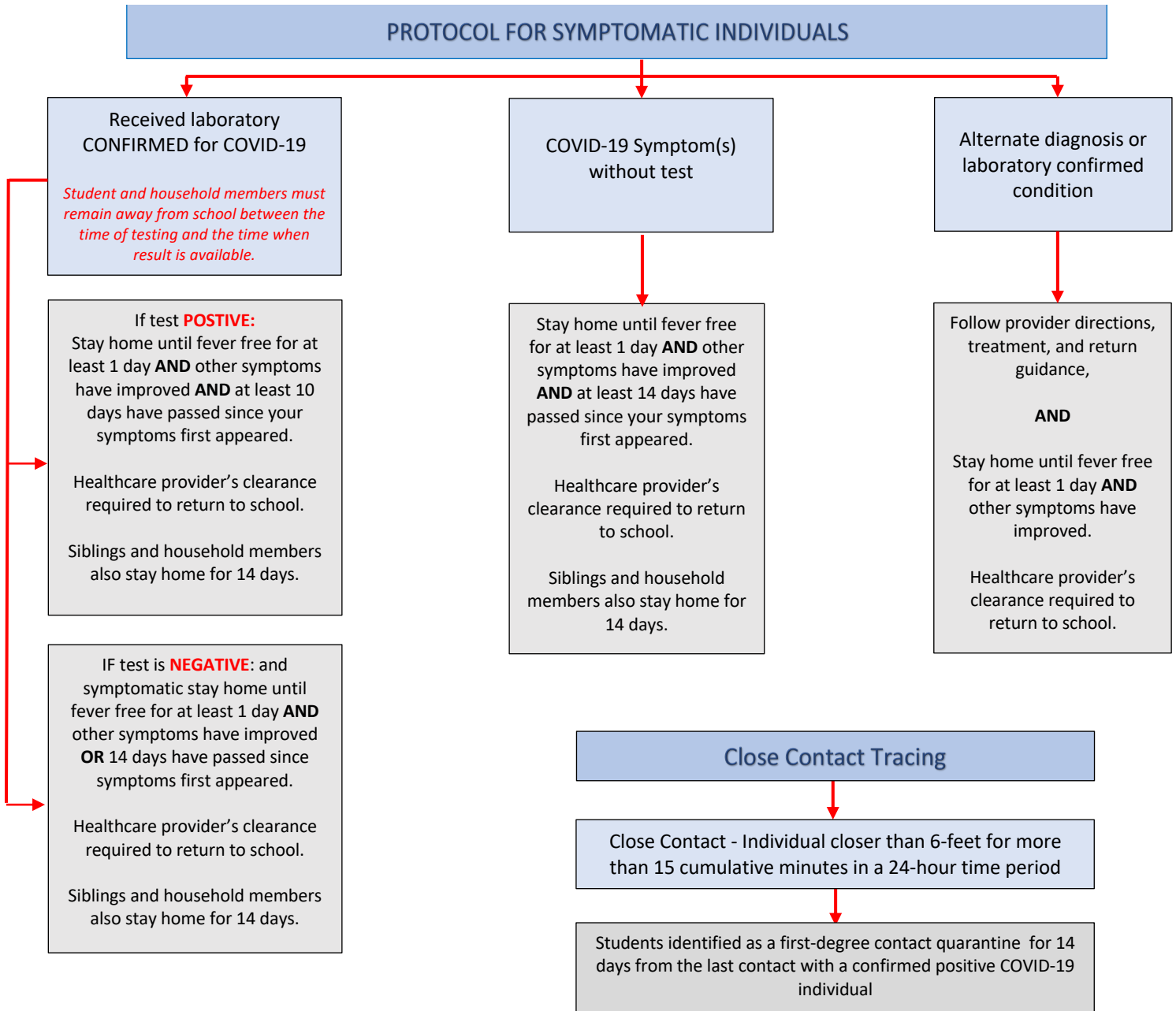
The "When to Stay Home" document represents a "decision tree" which will guide Lee-Scott Academy's health staff to determine the date that a student or faculty/staff member will be permitted to return to campus in the event of a possible or confirmed COVID infection. In the occasional "gray area" case, a physician advisory group will assist with that determination.

High-risk exposures: greater than 15 minutes, close contact, no mask worn by either party

Low-risk exposure: proper social distancing, mask worn by both parties

First-degree contact (FDC): household member, babysitter, coach, teacher, classmate (not someone at parent's office)

Students, faculty, and staff will be sent home if ANY of the following symptoms, or other symptoms determined by the CDC to be consistent with COVID-19, are present: cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fever of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, chills, repeated shaking, muscle pain, body aches, fatigue, headache, sore throat, runny nose, new loss of taste or smell, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal pain, persistent pain or pressure in chest, new confusion, or difficult to arise. For symptoms consistent with COVID-19, reference exclusion criteria below to determine when individuals may return. People who are ill should contact their health care provider for additional guidance.
