Comprehension:

- 1. Main character:

- 4. Who is Mr. Levine? What does he do and where and why?
- 5. Who else works at the Arts/Crafts center that Henry befriends?
- 6. What does Mr. Hairston do that defines his character?
- 7. What does Mr. Hairston want Henry to do?
- 8. Why does Mr. Hairston make this proposal to Henry?
- 9. What decision did Henry's make and what was the outcome?
- 10. How does Henry feel about what happened?

Theme Response #1: (2-3 complete sentences)

Taking responsibility for one's actions is the right thing to do, and Henry seems to want to do the right thing. However, he never tells George or Mr. Levine the truth about what happened. Why?

Theme Response #2 (2-3 complete sentences)

The title seems unusual for the novel until one realizes that Henry is "dancing" to Mr. Hairston's tune instead of Henry's own consciousness. Explain, with an example from the book, how Harry is convinced by Mr. Hairston to do what he believes is wrong.
