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**SUMMER READING ASSIGNMENT**

Welcome to Eighth Grade English! This summer you will be reading two (2) novels. The first is a classic story by Jeanne DuPrau entitled, *The City of Ember*. The second novel is your choice from the list in Part II. The assignments for summer reading are described below. All assignments will be due the first week of school. There will also be a test on each novel to assess knowledge and understanding within the second week of school.

**Part I: Required Reading:**

*The City of Ember* by Jeanne DuPrau (fiction)

Quick Summary: Lina and Doon discover the truth about their city and a secret message propels them to plan an escape.

**Assignment:** After reading *The City of Ember*, complete the questions on page 2 of this document.

**Part II: Required Fiction Choice** - Choose **one (1)** book from the list below:

A. *Call of the Wild* by Jack London (fiction)

Quick Summary: Buck, who has a peaceful life in California, suddenly finds himself in the frozen wild of Alaska learning how to survive during the Klondike Gold Rush.

B. *Grayson* by Lynne Cox (autobiography)

Quick Summary: Lynne, an Olympian, has a unique encounter with a baby whale as she trains in the ocean off California's coast.

C. *Tunes for Bears to Dance To* by Robert Cormier (historical fiction)

Quick Summary: Henry has a decision to make in this post-WWII novel of prejudice and acceptance of others.

**Assignment:** After reading 1 of the 3 novels listed above, complete the form on page 3 of this document.
