
- · Visit the library.

- Talk with mom and dad about what you read together. Answer questions about what you have read with your parents.
- Practice the following pre-primer sight words on index cards. (a, and, away, big, blue, can, come, down, find, funny, for, go, help, here, I, in, is, it, jump, little, look, make, me, my, not, one, play, red, run, said, see, the, three, to, two, up, we, where, yellow, you)
- Play board games (Candy Land, Chutes and Ladders, Hi-Ho Cherry O, Card Games, Dominoes, Dice Games)
- Play with play-dough, sand, Crayola Model Magic to create letters, shapes, numbers, animals, etc. Be creative! This will strengthen your fine motor skills as well as help with letter and number identification.
- Use scissors, crayons, paper, glue, to create beautiful artwork.
- Take walks and talk, talk, talk with your parents.
- Practice counting small groups of items. Examples: 5 Q-tips, 7 spoons, 12 noodles, 4 buttons, etc.
- Play with Legos, work puzzles, blocks, and spend lots of time OUTSIDE!

We hope you have a fun, safe summer! Keep the learning going! We look forward to seeing you in August!




Culminating Project to bring on your first day of kindergarten
















Shapes Find some squares in your home. Notice that they have 4 straight sides that are the same length and four corners. Draw as many different size squares as you can fit on this page.

Numbers Count out loud as high as you can jumping or clapping when you say each number. Write your numbers as high as you can!


Numbers Create a number collage. Cut out numbers from magazines or store ads and glue them on the paper.


Patterns Sketch a picture of your favorite animal. Greate a pattern on it.


Patterns Look in your closet. Read some of the patterns that are on your clothes. Sketch a picture of your family. Draw a pattern on each person's shirt/dress.


Counting
