Course Description:

I am looking forward to being your APUSH instructor next year. APUSH is made up of 9 time periods/units that will take us through “Exploration” through the “Modern Era”. Assessments will include AP College Board multiple choice questions (MCQ’s). If you took AP Euro, the writing requirements are similar. We will do Short Answer Questions (SAQs), Long Essay Questions (LEQ’s) and Document Based Questions (DBQ’s). All of these will focus around the 6 AP Historical Thinking Skills and the 3 Historical Reasoning Processes. The curriculum is very dense and moves pretty fast.

Prep for the Exam

We will have a Mock Exam in the Spring (optional but recommended).

We use 5 Steps to a 5 review and strategies in the late Spring.

The APUSH National Exam in May is required. It is 3 hours and 15 minutes long. 55 MCQ, 3 SAQs, 1 LEQ, and 1 DBQ.

These Summer assignments will help you get a jumpstart on the curriculum and baseline historical knowledge needed to be successful in this course.
