COUNSELING SPOTLIGHT

Our school counselor has been visiting Pre-K to 6th Grade classrooms biweekly to discuss topics including social skills, showing kindness/empathy, self-control, problem solving, mindfulness, conflict resolution, feelings, coping skills, and more. Our school counseling program follows the ASCA National Model to use research-based practices in teaching these skills. Research indicates comprehensive, data-driven school counseling programs improve a range of student learning and behavioral outcomes. While academics are important, shaping our students' hearts to build their character is equally as important. At LSA, we get the opportunity to bring scripture and a spiritual emphasis into the counseling lessons. Through our Warrior Word of the Month, the lower school students are encouraged to learn and use a character word that will help them grow in Godly character. Words have included responsibility, self-control, gratefulness, generosity, contentment, kindness, humility, initiative, and diligence. A scripture verse is paired with each character word, and students are encouraged to learn and put into practice these words in their everyday lives. We encourage you to ask your grandchild about what they are learning through their school counseling lessons!


VISITING AUTHOR JIMMY TIDMORE AND MISS ALABAMA AMERICA VISIT LSA
